WELCOME TO ST PETER'S 2021

Dear Friends:

It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the Cathedral with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

If you have not been vaccinated, please do so as soon as possible.

The Chief Public Health Office has ordered that those present at funeral and wedding receptions, concerts, and events like coffee hour need to be double vaccinated, and so we will record vaccination status of those present at our coffee hour. This record will only need to happen once. Those participating in worship are exempt from this requirement.

MASKS are not required while you are in your pew as long as physical distancing can be maintained. Masks are required to be worn in the aisle when entering or leaving, or going forward to receive Communion and while returning to your pew.

Consider the **SPACE** you might need, six feet apart, more or less, from anyone outside your household or circle of friends.

The offering plate will not be circulated. It will be available near the front door of the Cathedral.

For the time being, the sacrament of the Eucharist, will only be administered to the laity, in one kind, the bread. Please come forward to the chancel steps and return to your seat by the side aisle.

The December Meeting of the Bishop Binney Group will be held on Tuesday, December 7th, beginning at 1:00 p.m., in the Church Hall.

NOVEMBER 30, ANDREW THE APOSTLE. The name "Andrew" is from the Greek *manly, brave.* He was the brother of Simon Peter, and likewise a son of John, or Jonah, born in the village of Bethsaida on the Sea of Galilee, where they fished for a living with their father. The Gospel of John (John 1:35-42) says that Andrew was a disciple of John the Baptist, whose testimony first led him to follow Jesus. Andrew at once recognized Jesus as the Messiah, and hurried to introduce him to his brother. In the Gospel of Matthew (Matt 4:18-22) and in the Gospel of Mark (Mark 1:16-20), Simon Peter and Andrew were called by Jesus to become disciples and 'fishers of men". Andrew is said to have been martyred by crucifixion on an X-shaped cross, at his own request, as he deemed himself unworthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Jesus had been.

DECEMBER 4th c.150 - c.215, known as **CLEMENT OF ALEXANDRIA**, to distinguish him from the earlier Clement of Rome, was a Christian theologian who taught at the Catechetical School of Alexandria. A convert to Christianity, he was an educated man who was familiar with classical Greek philosophy and literature. Clement was influenced by Hellenistic philosophy to a greater extent than any other Christian thinker of his time, and in particular by Plato and the Stoics. In one of his works he argued that Greek philosophy had its origin among non-Greeks, claiming that both Plato and Pythagoras were taught by Egyptian scholars. Among his pupils were Origen and Alexander of Jerusalem.
