WELCOME TO ST PETER'S 2021

Dear Friends:

It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the Cathedral with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

If you have not been vaccinated, please do so as soon as possible.

The Chief Public Health Office has ordered that those present at funeral and wedding receptions, concerts, and events like coffee hour need to be double vaccinated, and so we will record vaccination status of those present at our coffee hour. This record will only need to happen once. Those participating in worship are exempt from this requirement.

MASKS are not required while you are in your pew as long as physical distancing can be maintained. Masks are required to be worn in the aisle when entering or leaving, or going forward to receive Communion and while returning to your pew.

Consider the **SPACE** you might need, six feet apart, more or less, from anyone outside your household or circle of friends.

The offering plate will not be circulated. It will be available near the front door of the Cathedral.

For the time being, the sacrament of the Eucharist, will only be administered to the laity, in one kind, the bread. Please come forward to the chancel steps and return to your seat by the side aisle.

DECEMBER 16th O SAPIENTIA begins the O Antiphons, which are the antiphons, or anthems, spoken or sung at Evensong, before and after Magnificat, on the last seven days of Advent. They are referred to as the "O Antiphons" because the title of each one begins with the interjection "O". Each antiphon is a name of Christ, given as one of his attributes mentioned in Scripture. They are:

December 17: O Sapientia (O Wisdom)

December 18: O Adonai (O Lord)

December 19: O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse)

December 20: O Clavis David (O Key of David)

December 21: O Oriens (O Dayspring)

December 22: O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations)

December 23: O Emmanuel (O With us is God)


The hymn (8 in the English Hymnal) O come, O come, Emmanuel is a lyrical paraphrase of these antiphons. The first letters of the titles taken backwards form a Latin acrostic of "Ero Cras" which translates to "Tomorrow, I will be [there]", mirroring the theme of the antiphons. The "O Antiphons" are significant for two reasons. First, each one is a title for the Messiah. Secondly, each one refers to the prophecy of Isaiah of the coming of the Messiah. [Note: Some Anglican churches, following medieval English usage, begin these antiphons on Dec. 16].

DECEMBER 17th IGNATIUS, BISHOP AND MARTYR.

Ignatius is one of the five Apostolic Fathers (the earliest authoritative group of the Church Fathers). Ignatius converted to Christianity at a young age. Ignatius, and his friend Polycarp, were disciples of John the Apostle. He was revered from his conversion as one who lived his life in the imitation of Christ. Later in his life St. Peter himself appointed Ignatius to the episcopal see of Antioch. A tradition arose that he was one of the children whom Jesus took in his arms and blessed. Epistles attributed to Ignatius report his arrest by the authorities and travel to Rome: "From Syria even to Rome I fight with wild beasts, by land and sea, by night and by day, being bound amidst ten leopards, even a company of soldiers, who only grow worse when they are kindly treated." — Ignatius to the Romans, 5.

DECEMBER 16th, 18th, and 19th EMBER DAYS. In the liturgical calendar of the Western Christian churches, Ember days are four separate sets of three days within the same week – specifically, the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday – roughly equidistant in the circuit of the year, set aside for fasting and prayer. These days are set apart for special prayer and fasting and are especially suitable for the ordination of clergy.
