It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the Cathedral with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

SEPTEMBER 8th NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY.

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Conception of Mary on December 8 (nine months earlier).

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal Gospel of James fills in the gap. According to this account, her parents, Anna and Joachim, are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child that will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story (like many biblical counterparts) stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning.
