### Food Bank Sunday - September 19, 2021

Parishioners of St. Peter's are asked to support the Charlottetown and area Food Bank in the spirit of helping those with the most basic of human needs, on the third Sunday of each month. Canned baked beans is the requested item for the month of September.

**SEPTEMBER 14th HOLY CROSS DAY** commemorates the Cross used in the crucifixion of Jesus. While Good Friday is dedicated to the Passion of Christ and the Crucifixion, this day celebrates the historical reality of the Cross itself, as the instrument of salvation. According to Christian tradition, the True Cross was discovered in 326 by Saint Helena, the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine the Great, during a pilgrimage she made to Jerusalem. The Church of the Holy Sepulchre was then built at the site of the discovery, by order of Helena and Constantine.

**SEPTEMBER 15th, 17th, and 18th EMBER DAYS.** In the liturgical calendar of the Western Christian churches, Ember days are four separate sets of three days within the same week – specifically, the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday – roughly equidistant in the circuit of the year, set aside for fasting and prayer. These days are set apart and are especially suitable for the ordination of clergy.
