It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the Cathedral with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

SEPTEMBER 29: MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS. Michael means *'Who is like God?'*, Saint Michael the Archangel. Michael is mentioned three times in the Book of Daniel. In the New Testament, Michael leads God's armies against Satan's forces in the Book of Revelation, Chapter 12, where during the war in heaven he defeats Satan. In the Epistle of Jude Michael is specifically referred to as "the archangel Michael". Saint Michael is depicted in the window nearest the front door of the Chapel. On the Feast of Michael and All Angels, popularly called Michaelmas, we give thanks for the many ways in which God's loving care watches over us, both directly and indirectly, and we are reminded that the richness and variety of God's creation far exceeds our knowledge of it.

SEPTEMBER 30: JEROME c.347 - 30 September 420) was a Latin priest, confessor, theologian, and historian. He is best known for his translation of most of the Bible into Latin and his commentaries on the Gospels. Jerome is recognized as a saint and Doctor of the Church. He is often represented as one of the four Latin doctors of the Church along with Augustine of Hippo, Ambrose, and Pope Gregory, as he is in All Souls' Chapel.

CLEMENT CARELSE

Please welcome Clement Carelse, organist and choir director, to St Peter's Cathedral. Reverend Carelse, who is an ordained Deacon, was originally scheduled to come to St Peter's in June 2020 to audition/interview for the position of Music Director. Because of travel restrictions due to Covid 19, his visit had to be delayed until now and we are so pleased that he is finally here!

A native of South Africa, Clem began his study of the organ and church music at an early age, coming from a family of organists. At the age of thirteen he was the organist at St John's, Capetown, before emigrating to Canada in 1966. In Canada he studied the organ with Charles Peaker, Mellville Cook and John Sidgwick, and choral conducting with John Sidgwick, Keith Bissell and Frank Thorolfson. He earned a B.A. in Music, Religious Studies and Sociology at McMaster University in Hamilton and did additional music course work at York University in Toronto.

Currently a resident of Toronto, Clem has sung in numerous choirs and in 1995 became the Organist and Choirmaster at All Saints, Kingsway. In 2007 he left All Saints and became the Organist and Choirmaster at St Peter's Erindale in Mississauga. As an organist and choir director Clem has toured the UK extensively with his choirs performing in many cathedrals including St Paul's, London, Ely, Gloucester and Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin.

In addition, Clem is also an organ builder having replaced the organ at St Peter's Erindale with a 'rescue' Casavant from Verdun, Quebec. In June 2016 he was ordained to the Vocational Diaconate.

You are welcome to meet Clem and have a chat at coffee hour after this morning's service.

Fundscrip Explanation

As many of you know, we, like many other churches, sport teams, etc raise funds through the company called **Fundscrip**. This is a great way to generate revenue with very minimal effort on our part. We thought an explanation of this system might be helpful.

How does this work?

Individuals exchange their cash for store cards which they then use when shopping at that store.

Does this cost the individuals?

No, it is an even swap - cash for store cards.

How does St Peter's make money from this?

The stores give back to us a small percentage (1-5%) of the cards we use in their stores.

Is there a benefit to me as well?

Yes. Each user gets a tax receipt from St Peter's for the amount of that percentage we generated back to the church.

How do I get the store cards?

There are order forms (with a list of the participating stores) at the back of the church to fill out. Hand this form, along with a cheque or cash for the cards you want, to either **Jack Stewart or Bill Leuty**, or into the Church Office. Within one week you will be given the cards you ordered. Then you are free to use them when you shop.

An Example: -

Use an Ultramar card the next time you get gas, use a Starbucks card for your next cup of coffee, or use a grocery store card for some of your grocery shopping, etc. (For every dollar of rebate that you create for St Peter's, you get a tax receipt at the end of the year.)
