We welcome all visitors with us today and invite you to join us for Coffee & Tea in the Cathedral Hall following the 10:30 a.m. service. **OCTOBER 4th ST FRANCIS OF ASSISI** born Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone, informally named as Francesco 1181/1182 - 3 October 1226 was an Italian friar and preacher. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of Saint Clare, the Third Order of Saint Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land. Francis is one of the most venerated religious figures in history.

Pope Gregory IX canonized Francis on 16 July 1228. Along with Saint Catherine of Siena, he was designated Patron saint of Italy. He later became associated with patronage of animals and the natural environment, and it became customary for Roman Catholic and Anglican churches to hold ceremonies blessing animals on his feast day of 4 October.

In 1219 he went to Egypt in an attempt to convert the Sultan to put an end to the conflict of the Crusades. In 1223, Francis arranged for the first Christmas live nativity scene. According to Christian tradition, in 1224 he received the stigmata during the apparition of Seraphic angels in a religious ecstasy making him the first recorded person in Christian history to bear the wounds of Christ's Passion. He died during the evening hours of 3 October 1226, while listening to a reading he had requested of Psalm 142.

OCTOBER 6th WILLIAM TYNDALE, Translator and Martyr (c. 1494-1536) was an English scholar who became a leading figure in Protestant reform in the years leading up to his execution.

In 1535, Tyndale was arrested and jailed in the castle of Vilvoorde outside Brussels for over a year. In 1536, he was convicted of heresy and executed by strangulation, after which his body was burnt at the stake. His dying prayer was that the King of England's eyes would be opened. This prayer seemed to find its fulfillment just two years later with King Henry's authorization of the Great Bible for the Church of England — which was largely Tyndale's own work. Hence the Tyndale Bible, as it was known, continued to play a key role in spreading Reformation ideas across the English speaking world. In 1611 the 54 scholars who produced the King James Bible drew significantly from Tyndale, as well as from translations that descended from his. One estimate suggests the New Testament in the King James Version is 83% Tyndale's and the Old Testament 76%. His translation of the Bible was the first to be printed in English, and became a model for subsequent English translations.
