WELCOME TO ST PETER'S 2021

Dear Friends:

It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the Cathedral with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

If you have not been vaccinated, please do so as soon as possible.

Please continue to observe the direction of the Chief Public Health Officer. Stay safe and keep others safe. Sanitize your **HANDS**.

The Chief Public Health Office has ordered that those present at funeral and wedding receptions, concerts, and events like coffee hour need to be double vaccinated, and so we will record vaccination status of those present at our coffee hour. This record will only need to happen once. Those participating in worship are exempt from this requirement.

Masks are **not** required while you are in your pew as long as physical distancing can be maintained. Masks are required to be worn in the aisle when entering or leaving, or going forward to receive Communion and while returning to your pew.

Consider the **SPACE** you might need, six feet apart, more or less, from anyone outside your household or circle of friends.

The offering plate will not be circulated. It will be available near the front door of the Cathedral.

For the time being, the sacrament of the Eucharist, will only be administered to the laity, in one kind, the bread. Please come forward to the chancel steps and return to your seat by the side aisle.

OCTOBER 28th SIMON and JUDE, THE APOSTLES. Apart from their names in the Gospel, there is very little we know definitely about these two Apostles. Simon is called either the Canaanite or the Zealot (Mt. 10:4, Mk 3:18, Lk 6:15, Acts 1:13) by the evangelists to distinguish him from Simon Peter. Both titles come from the Hebrew *qana*, which means 'the zealous one'. After Pentecost, Simon, like several other Apostles, is not heard of again in the New Testament. However, there is an abundance of legends about his subsequent life and final martyrdom. One tradition affirms that he first preached in Egypt. He then joined his fellow Apostle Jude, who was in Mesopotamia, and they both went east to Persia. Here they were martyred at Sufian. In art Simon is usually symbolized with a boat or a falchion (an axe-like sword), allegedly the weapon by which heathen priests cut him down.

Jude, called "Judas, son of James", is mentioned by Luke in his gospel (Lk 6:16) and in the Acts (Acts 1:13) and also in John 14:22. He is believed to be the author of the Letter in the New Testament bearing his name. In more modern times, Jude has acquired the reputation as the 'patron of hopeless cases'. The origin of this devotion is said to be that no one would pray to him because his name was so like that of the traitor Judas Iscariot. Only people who had tried every other option would in desperation turn to him!
