**WELCOME TO ST PETER'S 2021**

**Dear Friends:**

It is now possible for us to worship with 50 people in the nave of the Cathedral with a second cohort of 50 people in a separate space.

**If you have not been vaccinated, please do so as soon as possible.**

**The Chief Public Health Office has ordered that those present at funeral and wedding receptions, concerts, and events like coffee hour need to be double vaccinated, and so we will record vaccination status of those present at our coffee hour. This record will only need to happen once. Those participating in worship are exempt from this requirement.**

**MASKS** are not required while you are in your pew as long as physical distancing can be maintained. Masks are required to be worn in the aisle when entering or leaving, or going forward to receive Communion and while returning to your pew.

Consider the **SPACE** you might need, six feet apart, more or less, from anyone outside your household or circle of friends.

The offering plate will not be circulated. It will be available near the front door of the Cathedral.

For the time being, the sacrament of the Eucharist, will only be administered to the laity, in one kind, the bread. Please come forward to the chancel steps and return to your seat by the side aisle.

Requiem Eucharist

The Rector's father, Cameron Garrett, died Tuesday, November 2nd, All Souls' Day. A Requiem Eucharist will be offered Saturday, November 20th, at 11:00 a.m. in the Cathedral.

**NOVEMBER 16th HUGH OF LINCOLN** (1135/40-16 November 1200) was a French noble, Benedictine and Carthusian monk, bishop of Lincoln in England. At the time of the Reformation, he was the best-known English saint after Thomas Becket. Hugh's primary emblem is a white swan, in reference to the story of the swan of Stowe, which had a deep and lasting friendship with the saint, even guarding him while he slept. The swan would follow him about, and was his constant companion while he was at Lincoln.

**NOVEMBER 16th MARGARET OF SCOTLAND** (c. 1045-16 November 1093) was an English princess of the House of Wessex. Born in exile in Hungary, she was the sister of Edgar Ætheling, the short-ruling and uncrowned Anglo-Saxon King of England. Margaret and her family returned to England in 1057, but fled to the Kingdom of Scotland following the Norman conquest of England of 1066. Around 1070 Margaret married Malcolm III of Scotland, becoming his queen consort. Margaret's biographer Turgot, Bishop of St. Andrews, credits her with having a civilizing influence on her husband Malcolm by reading him stories from the Bible. She instigated religious reform, striving to make the worship and practices of the church in Scotland conform to those of the continental church of her childhood. This she did with the inspiration and guidance of Lanfranc, the future Archbishop of Canterbury. Due to these achievements, she was considered an exemplar of the "just ruler", and influenced her husband and children—especially her youngest son, later David I - also to be just and holy rulers.

**NOVEMBER 20th EDMUND KING AND MARTYR** (also known as St Edmund or Edmund of East Anglia, died 20 November 869) was king of East Anglia from about 855 until his death. Edmund's cult flourished in the early and High Middle Ages, and he and Edward the Confessor were regarded as England's patron saints until they were replaced by Saint George in the fifteen century. Almost nothing is known about Edmund. He is thought to have been of East Anglian origin and was first mentioned in an annal of the Anglo-Saxon Chronicle, written some years after his death. The kingdom of East Anglia was devastated by the Vikings, who destroyed any contemporary evidence of his reign. Later writers produced fictitious accounts of his life, asserting that he was born in 841, the son of Æthelweard, an obscure East Anglian King, whom it was said Edmund succeeded when he was 14 (or alternatively that he was the youngest son of a Germanic king named Alcmund).

## Fundscrip Explanation

As many of you know, we, like many other churches, sport teams, etc raise funds through the company called **Fundscrip**. This is a great way to generate revenue with very minimal effort on our part. We thought an explanation of this system might be helpful.

### How does this work?

Individuals exchange their cash for store cards which they then use when shopping at that store.

### Does this cost the individuals?

No, it is an even swap - cash for store cards.

### How does St Peter's make money from this?

The stores give back to us a small percentage (1-5%) of the cards we use in their stores.

### Is there a benefit to me as well?

Yes. Each user gets a tax receipt from St Peter's for the amount of that percentage we generated back to the church.

### How do I get the store cards?

There are order forms (with a list of the participating stores) at the back of the church to fill out. Hand this form, along with a cheque or cash for the cards you want, to either **Jack Stewart or Bill Leuty**, or into the Church Office. Within one week you will be given the cards you ordered. Then you are free to use them when you shop.

### An Example: -

Use an Ultramar card the next time you get gas, use a Starbucks card for your next cup of coffee, or use a grocery store card for some of your grocery shopping, etc. (For every dollar of rebate that you create for St Peter's, you get a tax receipt at the end of the year.)
