Blessing and Imposition of Ashes

When the choir, clergy, and servers have entered, the Priest standing at the Altar will offer the prayer for the Blessing of the Ashes.

Priest: O GOD, who desirest not the death of a sinner,
but rather that he may turn from his wickedness and live:

We beseech thee to have compassion on the frailty of our nature,
and of thy goodness to bless ✠ these ashes now to be set upon our heads
as a token of humility and a recollection of our mortality;
that we acknowledging ourselves to be but dust and ashes,
may of thy love and mercy be found worthy of thy redemption and new life,
through Jesus Christ our Lord. **People. Amen.**

Priest and People: Let us change our raiment for sackcloth and ashes;
let us fast and mourn before the Lord,
for our God is merciful to forgive us our sins.

Please kneel at the altar rail for the imposition

Priest: Dust thou art and unto dust shalt thou return. Genesis 3.19

The clergy, servers, and choir will receive the ashes first.

The Lesson sitting Joel 2. 12 -18 *God is rich in mercy to those who repent*

Therefore also now, saith the Lord, turn ye even to me with all your heart,
and with fasting, and with weeping, and with mourning: and rend your heart,
and not your garments, and turn unto the Lord your God: for he is gracious and
merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repenteth him of the evil.

Who knoweth if he will return and repent, and leave a blessing behind him;
even a meat offering and a drink offering unto the Lord your God?

Blow the trumpet in Zion, sanctify a fast, call a solemn assembly: gather the
people, sanctify the congregation, assemble the elders, gather the children, and
