FundScrip Explanation

As many of you know, we, like many other sports teams, churches, etc raise funds through the company called FundScrip. This is a great way to generate revenue with very minimal effort on our part. We thought an explanation of this system might be handy.

How does this work? Individuals exchange their cash for store cards which they then use when shopping at that store.

Does this cost the individuals? No, it is an even swap – cash for store cards.

How does St. Peter's make money from this? The stores give back to us a small percentage (1-5%) of the cards we all use in their stores.

Is there a benefit to me as well? Yes. Each user gets a tax receipt from St. Peters for the amount of that percentage we generated back to the church.

How do I get the store cards? There are order forms (with a list of the participating stores) at the back of the church to fill out. Hand this, along with a cheque or cash for the cards you want, to Jack Stewart or into the church office.

Within one week you will be given the cards you ordered. Then you are free to use them when you shop. Example- Use an Ultramar card the next time you get gas, use a Starbucks card for your next coffee, use a grocery store card for some of your grocery shopping, etc.

For every dollar of rebate that you create for St. Peter's you get a tax receipt at the end of the year!

from The Crown of the Year by Austin Farrer, weekly paragraphs on the Holy Sacrament. None shall appear before me empty-handed, said the voice of God to ancient Israel. So the worshipper came pulling in a ram by the horn, or carrying a pair of doves. We do not come empty-handed, our hand being in the hand of Christ, as he goes onward to his sacrifice. Is he our victim, then, and do we lead him to God's altar? Yes, he is our victim; he goes with us willingly, to make our peace with God. But do we lead him, or is it he that leads us? The question cannot be answered one way or the other. It is one mind that leads both him and us to the altar, but that mind is the mind of Christ, his mind mastering ours. His will is that we should offer him; yet with himself he offers us. He too will not be empty-handed; he will present us along with himself. And his desire is to present us not as empty men, empty hearts to God: happy if he can present us full of good works and faithful prayers since our last communion; if not so, then full at least of penitence and careful resolution for the coming days; but not empty, not just empty.
