THE CONFIRMATION

The Bishop shall require

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS, *saying to the candidates:*

DO you here, *Frances; Lincoln; Kamran; Zahra; Javier;*

in the presence of God and of this Congregation, renounce the devil and all his works, the pomps and vanity of this wicked world, and all the sinful lusts of the flesh?

The Candidates Answer. I do.

Bishop. Let us recite the Apostles' Creed, the Articles of our Belief

The whole congregation answers together, standing

I BELIEVE in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth:

And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, Born of the Virgin Mary, Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, dead, and buried: He descended into hell; The third day he rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Ghost; The holy Catholic Church; The

Communion of Saints; The Forgiveness of sins; ✠ The Resurrection of the body, And the Life everlasting. Amen. The congregation may be seated

Bishop. Do you believe the Christian Faith as it is set forth in the Apostles' Creed?

The Candidates Answer. I do.

Bishop. Will you endeavour to keep God's holy will and commandments, and to walk in the same all the days of your life?

The Candidates Answer. I will, God being my helper.

After this, all kneeling, the Congregation shall pray for the Candidates, for which silence shall be kept for a space.

After which shall be sung by the Bishop Veni, Creator Spiritus;

the Bishop beginning, and all present, answering by verses, as follows.

COME, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire,

And lighten with celestial fire.

Thou the anointing Spirit art,

Who dost thy seven-fold gifts impart.

Thy blessed Unction from above

Is comfort, life, and fire of love.

Enable with perpetual light

The dullness of our blinded sight.

Anoint and cheer our soiled face

With the abundance of thy grace.

Keep far our foes, give peace at home:

Where thou art guide, no ill can come.

Teach us to know the Father, Son,

And thee, of both, to be but One;

That, through the ages all along,

This may be our endless song:

Praise to thy eternal merit,

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Then shall the Bishop proceed with THE CONFIRMATION, Commending those who are to be confirmed to the prayers of the Congregation. and saying:

OUR help is in the Name of the Lord; *Answer. Who hath made heaven and earth.*

Bishop. Blessed be the Name of the Lord; *Answer. Henceforth, world without end.*

Bishop. Lord, hear our prayer; *Answer. And let our cry come unto thee.*

/over

Bishop. Let us pray. ALMIGHTY and everliving God, who hast vouchsafed to regenerate these thy servants by Water and the Holy Spirit, and hast given unto them forgiveness of all their sins:

Confirm and strengthen them, we beseech thee, O Lord, with the Holy Spirit the Comforter, and daily increase in them thy manifold gifts of grace; the spirit of *wisdom* and *understanding*; the spirit of *counsel* and *might*; the spirit of *knowledge* and true *godliness*; and fill them. O Lord, with the spirit of thy *holy fear*, now and forever. Amen.

Then the candidates come forward with their witnesses and kneeling before the Bishop,

she shall lay her hands upon the head of every one in order, saying:

Bishop. DEFEND, O Lord, this thy Servant *Frances; Lincoln; Kamran; Zahra; Javier;* with thy heavenly grace, that *she* may continue thine forever; and daily increase in thy Holy Spirit, more and more, until *she* come unto thy everlasting kingdom. Amen.

Then shall the Bishop say: The Lord be with you;

Answer. And with thy spirit.

Bishop. Let us pray.

Bishop. OUR Father who art in heaven

People. who art in heaven Hallowed be thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, For ever and ever. Amen.

Then the Bishop shall say: ALMIGHTY and everliving God, who makest us both to will and to do such things as be good and acceptable unto thy Divine Majesty:

We make our humble supplications unto thee for these thy servants, upon whom, after the example of thy holy Apostles, we have now laid our hands, to certify them, by this sign, of thy favour and gracious goodness towards them. Let thy fatherly hand, we beseech thee, ever be over them; let thy Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of thy Word, that in the end they may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

O ALMIGHTY Lord, and everlasting God, vouchsafe, we beseech thee, to direct, sanctify, and govern, both our hearts and bodies, in the ways of thy laws, and in the works of thy commandments; that through thy most mighty protection, both here and ever, we may be preserved in body and soul; through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Then the Bishop shall bless those confirmed, saying thus:

THE blessing of God Almighty, ✠ the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be upon you, and remain with you, forever. *Amen.*

MAY 1st PHILIP AND JAMES are remembered together because their relics were brought to Rome at the same time in early May.

PHILIP THE APOSTLE was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New Testament. Tradition tells us that Philip preached in Greece, Syria, and Asia-Minor. The Gospel of John recounts Philip's calling as a disciple from the city of Bethsaida, and the evangelist connects him with Andrew and Peter, who were from the same town. He also was among those surrounding John the Baptist when the latter first pointed out Jesus as the Lamb of God. It was Philip who first introduced Nathanael to Jesus

JAMES THE LESS one of the twelve disciples is called "the Less" to distinguish him from the Apostle James the Great who was the brother of John the Apostle.

MAY 2nd ATHANASIUS c. 296–298 – 2 May 373 was a Christian theologian and the 20th Patriarch of Alexandria, Egypt. His intermittent episcopacy spanned 45 years of which over 17 encompassed five exiles, when he was replaced on the order of four different Roman emperors because of his defense of Trinitarianism against Arianism, (which that declared that Christ is not truly divine but a created being)

The Council of Nicaea (AD 325) condemned Arius and declared the Son to be "of one substance with the Father."

MAY 4th MONICA (c. 332 – 387) was an early North African Christian saint and the mother of Augustine of Hippo. She is remembered for her outstanding Christian virtues, particularly the suffering caused by her husband's adultery, and her prayerful life dedicated to the reformation of her son, who wrote extensively of her pious acts and life with her in his Confessions.

from **The Crown of the Year** by *Austin Farrer*, **weekly paragraphs on the Holy Sacrament.** Who has not sometimes thought: If I could see Jesus Christ as he was on this earth; if I could talk with him, if I could have certainty from those divine lips, and read assurance in those steady eyes, then I should lay hold of God. So we think, but not so he teaches. He is in the Supper Room, desiring in that last opportunity to enlighten his disciples' minds and to assure their faith. But beyond a point he cannot. He cannot teach them as fully, he says, as the Holy Ghost will teach them hereafter. It is not so much the word of Jesus knocking at the mind's door that secures his admittance; it is the God within drawing the bolts with invisible fingers. When your pride, he says, when your self-sufficiency has been shattered by the experience of my death, the Spirit will secure the admittance of all the truth you need to know. And so it is: after half an hour's repentance before the cross of Christ, the Spirit shows us what years of study cannot discover, and what Christ present in the flesh might not avail to make us see.
