Acts of the Apostles 1.9

The Ascension of Jesus is the Christian belief, reflected in Scripture and in the Christian Creeds that Jesus ascended to Heaven after his resurrection, where he was exalted as Lord, sitting at the right hand of the Father. It illustrates the divinity of Christ and his powerful place in the Trinity with the Father and the Holy Spirit, in eternity.

A **High Mass will be celebrated at 7.00 p.m.** by Father Peter Harris, our former rector. The sung portions will be sung in Latin. As well as the usual Gregorian Chant Propers, the choir will sing F.J. Haydn's ***St. Nicholas Mass*** and Gabriel Fauré's beautiful ***Cantique de Jean Racine***, accompanied by a small orchestra.

A reception will follow in the cathedral Hall.
