Holy Communion *Every Christian who is baptized and a communicant in his or own congregation is welcome to receive Holy Communion. The Sacrament is offered in both bread and wine. If you choose not to receive the wine, please fold your arms **X** and remain at the rail to hear the words of administration. If the rail is full to the middle please go as far to the left as possible before you kneel so that others will not have to walk over your legs.*
