**INTERCESSION** is the act of praying to God on behalf of others. The Apostle Paul urges Timothy that specified prayers should be made for all people. *I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.* 1 Timothy 2:1–2 St. Paul believed intercession to be one of the most important aspects of faith and praying life, as praying for others is a recurring theme in his works. Prayer acts as a way for him to acknowledge God's power. This kind of prayer acts as a way for the Apostle to *"share in ... the Father's redeeming love"*. Paul believed that prayer transformed the person doing the praying, as much as the one being prayed for, which creates a stronger bond between him and God.

**Daily** we pray for Gethin Edward, St. Alban's Church, Souris and St. George's Church, Montague. St. Peter's Cathedral has supported the witness of Anglicanism in Kings County for close to two hundred years. The congregations in Souris and Montague were gathered by Canon Robert Tuck more recently in the early 1980's. We continue their witness to Christ and fellowship in the Gospel. Fr. Gethin Edward, a son of St. Peter's officiates week by week at St. George's, Montague. With more funding we could extend his ministry.

**This week** we pray for Melter Tais the diocese of Sabah and the Church of the Province of South East Asia which was created in 1996 out of four dioceses of Kuching, Sabah, Singapore and West Malaysia. There are approximately 98,000 Anglicans there within the province of a population of 3.9 million.
