Blessing of the Simnel Cake

Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, who didst feed the multitude of five thousand people long ago, with five loaves and two fish; we ask thee to nourish us spiritually, and to be the food of our souls. Bless ✠ this simnel cake, and grant that it may be for us a sign of thy love, which provides all our needs; through Jesus Christ, the Bread of Heaven. **People. Amen.**

The Simnel Cake may be distributed following the Eucharist.

MARCH 12th GREGORY THE GREAT, 64th Bishop of Rome, Doctor *teacher* of the Church. He is known not only for his theological writings, but also his contribution to the Worship and the Music of the Church. He was a Hymn writer, four of which appear in our hymn book 50, 66, 165 and 68, "*The Glory of These Forty Days*" which we sang last Sunday.

It is said that while he was passing a slave market in in Rome he noticed some children, set apart by their blond hair and blue eyes. When he asked who they were and where they came from, he was told, "*They are Angles*". He replied, "*Not Angles, but Angels*". He then freed them. This event is said to have inspired him to send Augustine the first Archbishop of Canterbury to England, to begin the mission to the Angles or Anglo Saxons in southern England. His meeting with the children is depicted in the painting in the Chapel nearest the Lectern.
