BENEDICTION

What is Benediction?

The word "Benediction" means to give and receive a blessing.

What happens at the Benediction service?

At the end of a Festal Evensong, bells ring to signal a moment of special holiness. The Priest approaches the altar holding the Monstrance. "Monstrance" is related to the word "demonstrate." It is a beautifully decorated vessel which contains some of the consecrated Host.

The act of Benediction occurs when, following verses of adoration, the Priest blesses the congregation by making the Sign of the Cross with the Monstrance itself. The Benediction service concludes with some appropriate prayers and chants.

What is the value of the Benediction service?

Insofar as the Risen Lord is believed to be truly present in the consecrated Host, the Benediction service is a special opportunity to focus our senses and thoughts on Christ, the sacrificial love of God, and our response to that love.

SEPTEMBER 29: MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS: Michael means 'Who is like God?', Saint Michael the Archangel. Michael is mentioned three times in the Book of Daniel. In the New Testament, Michael leads God's armies against Satan's forces in the Book of Revelation, Chapter 12, where during the war in heaven he defeats Satan. In the Epistle of Jude, Michael is specifically referred to as "the archangel Michael". Saint Michael is depicted in the window nearest the front door of All Souls' Chapel. On the Feast of Michael and All Angels, popularly called Michaelmas, we give thanks for the many ways in which God's loving care watches over us, both directly and indirectly, and we are reminded that the richness and variety of God's creation far exceeds our knowledge of it.

from **The Crown of the Year** *by Austin Farrer,* **weekly paragraphs on the Holy Sacrament**. Thanksgiving, eucharist, is the very name of this sacrament, and it is the occasion appointed by God himself for us to offer our thanksgivings to him at all times. The only perfect thanksgiving ever made is the thanksgiving of the Son of God to his Eternal Father, and so thankful he is, that he finds the giving of his whole being continually to his Father not too much for the expression of his thanks. And when he came amongst us men for our salvation, his thank offering to the Father embraced not only his life, but his voluntary death. On the night before he died, he gave us this sacrament, and he gave it under the form of thanksgiving, adapting to his purpose the common Jewish thanksgivings for food and drink. We give thanks in his eucharist for all the bread of God; for food, for the nourishment of mind and soul—and has not God given us such a mind that it is fed with all his wondrous works, and such a soul as to feed on Jesus Christ, Man and God?
