BENEDICTION

What is Benediction?

The word “Benediction” means to give and receive a blessing.

What happens at the Benediction service?

At the end of a Festal Evensong, bells ring to signal a moment of special holiness. The Priest approaches the altar holding the Monstrance. “Monstrance” is related to the word “demonstrate.” It is a beautifully decorated vessel which contains some of the consecrated Host.

The act of Benediction occurs when, following verses of adoration, the Priest blesses the congregation by making the Sign of the Cross with the Monstrance itself. The Benediction service concludes with some appropriate prayers and chants.

What is the value of the Benediction?

Insofar as the Risen Lord is believed to be truly present in the consecrated Host, the Benediction service is a special opportunity to focus our senses and thoughts on Christ, the sacrificial love of God, and our response to that love.

SEPTEMBER 29: MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS: Michael means ‘Who is like God?’. Saint Michael the Archangel. Michael is mentioned three times in the Book of Daniel. In the New Testament, Michael leads God’s armies against Satan’s forces in the Book of Revelation, Chapter 12, where during the war in heaven he defeats Satan. In the Epistle of Jude, Michael is specifically referred to as “the Archangel Michael”. Saint Michael is depicted in the window nearest the front door of All Souls’ Chapel, in the series of three windows that illustrate Revelation 12. On the Feast of Michael and All Angels, popularly called Michaelmas, we give thanks for the many ways in which God’s loving care watches over us, both directly and indirectly, and we are reminded that the richness and variety of God’s creation far exceeds our knowledge of it.

Question Box Response:

Question: When a soul is not baptized, can the soul enter heaven if the person lives a good life?

In the Anglican church the sacraments are outward and visible signs of inward and spiritual grace. Baptism and the Eucharist are the two sacraments “ordained of Christ our Lord in the Gospel”. In Matthew’s gospel Jesus says, “Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit...”

All of this underscores what an important step baptism is for Christians, and it should not be undertaken lightly. That being said, Baptism is a sign of God’s love for us. Our actions or lack of action never put us beyond beyond the reach of God’s grace. By faith we acknowledge God’s love.

The thief hanging on a cross next to Jesus said, ‘Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.’ And Jesus replied, ‘Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.’ The thief wasn’t baptized but his faith brought him to know Christ and accept his love.

Faith is our response to Christ’s salvation offered to us on the cross and getting baptized is the public act affirming that faith. It is an important step in our faith journey but not a requirement of salvation.

from The Crown of the Year by Austin Farrer, weekly paragraphs on the Holy Sacrament. St Francis de Sales says that it is a special sign of God’s goodness that he actually commands us to love him. It is wonderful enough if he permits us to love him; a few brave spirits might avail themselves of due permission. It is still more wonderful if he invites us to love him the responsive and the generous might answer the invitation. But he commands us to love him, because he will have us all to do so. He will not be deprived of any man’s love. Nor will he be deprived of any part of our love, for he commands us not merely to love him, but to love him with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength. The love of God holds out two hands to catch and take us: one is the commandment that we should love, the other is the act of his own love in the sacrifice of Jesus. He does not mean that we should escape him; see, he has taken us between his two hands.
