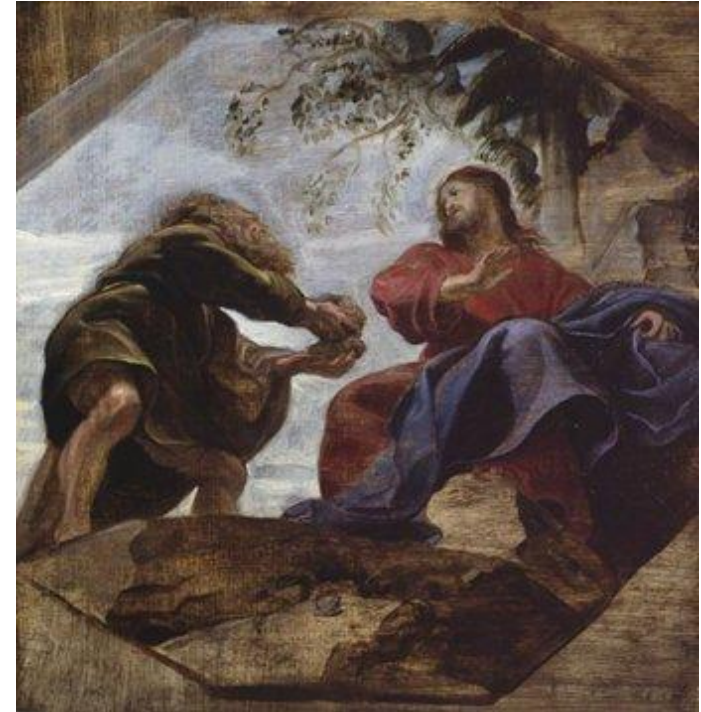

from **A Sermon for the First Sunday in Lent** by Robert Crouse. "Then was Jesus led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil." And there, in the wilderness, an explanation comes. God's kingdom, the age-long conflict of good and evil, of light and darkness, is in this moment fully explained. In general, the things of darkness are things obscure and confused, muddled and indefinite; but the coming of light makes them plain. In the clear simplicity of the desert, away from all the familiar distractions, the conflict becomes an open one: the devil, that is to say, is manifest. And in the temptations of Jesus, the nature and forms of that conflict are made clear. [...] These temptations of Jesus represent the essential forms of all temptation; they are our temptations, and the temptations of the Church. They are the illusions that we can use the divine spirit for worldly ends, that we can make God subject to our whims and idle curiosities, that we can be as absolute as God. [...] St. John, in his first Epistle, summing up the three forms of temptation, puts the matter this way: "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the pride of life, is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world passes away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever." (1 John 2.15-17)
